Since 1949, the Kansas City Metropolitan Crime Commission has worked behind the scenes to support law enforcement efforts in the Kansas City metropolitan area. We are a non-profit organization that fights for the security of the entire greater Kansas City area on both sides of the state line by operating innovative programs that help us power a safer, better Kansas City community. Here are just a few of our program's recent successes:

Our Greater Kansas City Crime Stoppers program is credited with saving the lives of 19 students in local schools through its Scholastic TIPS initiative. The Scholastic TIPS system is modeled after the TIPS Hotline and allows students to anonymously share information without fear of retribution. Students have utilized this resource (available in a free mobile app) to save the lives of their classmates by submitting anonymous TIPS which facilitated emergency intervention in 19 suicide attempts.

MCSP connects adjudicated individuals with established partner worksites to fulfill their court-ordered service, thus providing meaningful opportunities that have a profound impact on our community. MCSP also conducts weekly clean-ups along the streets of targeted high-crime areas of the community.

SAFE is currently providing ongoing support to 28 children of first responders who lost their lives in the line of duty. Bills. household expenses, and holidays don't stop coming when you lose a parent, but SAFE works to make things a little easier for families as they adjust to life without their loved one.

Second Chance asks former offenders to "take a chance on change" and become self-sufficient. Those who do are glad they did, as 84.5% of them are now successfully employed, productive members of society. Our community benefits, too, as we are all safer and saving over \$43.2 million taxpayer dollars every year that Second Chance participants are not incarcerated.

Crime Stoppers continues to see an increase in homicide TIPS as a result of increasing the reward to \$25,000 in KCMO, which has led to the solving of 24 total homicides, 15 in the past year alone. In the calendar year so far 2022, Crime Stoppers took over 3,691 TIPS resulting in 45 arrests, 61 cleared cases, and \$31,950.00 in anonymous cash rewards approved.
